Membership <u>updates</u>

As reported at previous Membership Meetings, there has been considerable discussion regarding membership benefits as well as the duties, responsibilities, and what is means to be a member of the Edgar Steam Club. At the October 2nd meeting the Board asked for an advisory vote asking if they should move forward with on the motion, "Members are required to work for your admission wristband". The members present voted unanimously to do "something". The board is still looking at options for "earning your wristband". Updates will be forthcoming.

As reported in Greg's message, the club is looking for ways to improve its finances. Much discussion was had about gate fees, whether member's should be charged an entrance fee even if they work, and the price of camping. As gate fees had already been raised and it seemed unfair to charge members who were working to support the show, it was decided that the camping fee would be raised to \$75. This fee includes access to bathrooms & showers, water, wi-fi, and garbage disposal. While the new fee may seem like a large jump, it is very much in line with camping prices around the state. This added revenue from the camping fee will help the club to recover from the previous years of sparce attendance.

In other news, the club will now be offering scholarships to graduating high school seniors. Club members, children, or grandchildren of members are eligible to apply. Keep this in mind if you know someone who will be graduating next year.

Much discussion has been had about the need for new roofing on the buildings at the grounds. It was decided that new steel was the best option. This summer the roof will be replaced on the pancake house shed and kitchen. The craft building roof will be replaced in the future as finances allow. The log cabin will be looked at as a full demo and rebuild project. This may take a few years to finish.
